After Accident, Mittman Turns to Story Medical

From Emergency Department right through Physical Therapy, Mittman lauds quality of care

After having open heart surgery in 2013, Barb Mittman performed her cardiac rehabilitation at Story Medical. The experience helped her make physical fitness a regular part of her life. Upon completing her rehab, Barb continued to use the gym facility — now known as the Medically Oriented Gym (MOG) — coming in each weekday around 5:45 a.m.

To add to her workouts, Barb often biked to the MOG, which is what she was doing one morning in late July 2019. Just a block from the Medical Center, Barb's brakes malfunctioned, sending her flying over the handlebars. Barb landed with a crash and immediately knew she was injured.

"It was ugly," Barb says. "A man across the way saw it and asked if I was alright and I told him I was, but I knew I wasn't. My chin was gushing blood all over the place and I had cuts and scrapes everywhere."

Bruised and battered, Barb was able to gather her bike—and a variety of broken pieces off it—and make her way the 100 or so yards to the Emergency Department at Story Medical. Once inside, the team immediately went to work on cleaning her up and determining the extent of her injuries.

"They put one person on my chin and for 20 minutes everyone worked around me cleaning me up," Barb remembers. "The staff was amazing."

Upon examination, the most significant damage was to Barb's mouth and jaw. She had a variety of bumps and bruises elsewhere, but the impact chipped several teeth, split her chin requiring stitches, and caused considerable soreness in her jaw. Further tests showed she luckily escaped any broken bones or a concussion, thanks in no part to the fact she was wearing a helmet.

Barb says the Emergency staff was so efficient that she was home within an hour, scheduling an appointment with her dentist to begin the process of repairing her teeth. Once that was set up, she put in a call to 21st Century Rehab to begin physical therapy.

Barb worked with Steve Cassabaum, DPT, at the 21st Century Rehab clinic at Story Medical. The priority was helping Barb regain flexibility in her jaw. Steve focused on ensuring that Barb was able to open and close her mouth without pain and that her newly repaired teeth lined up correctly. Barb says she completed about 10 weeks of therapy after the accident.

Her break from the MOG was significantly shorter.

"I think I maybe took the next day off (after the accident)," Barb says with a smile. "I just wanted to get right back to it."

Barb adds that she feels fortunate to have such convenient access to high quality care, whether it be for cardiac rehab after heart surgery, a regular workout in the MOG, or for a thorough exam and rehab after a scary tumble.

"I was amazed at how the emergency staff just methodically checked through everything like they had a checklist in their head," Barb says. "And then physical therapy was so great to me. I'm not sure people realize how much is available at Story Medical. It is so important to have this level of care right here in this community."

Ready for Anything

Dr. Curtis O'Loughlin embraces the challenge of providing care to those facing emergencies

When Dr. Curtis O'Loughlin tells you he's "seen it all" he is hardly exaggerating. As a physician in the Story Medical Emergency Department, he has to be on his toes at all times.

"You never know what is coming through that door," he says with a wide smile. "But as Emergency physicians we are diagnosticians. We are the ones who identify things and get care started."

Dr. O'Loughlin has served at Story Medical for just more than a year. He says rural Emergency Departments like Story Medical's play a vital role in the continuum of care. In an emergency, seeking out the bigger provider is rarely in your best interest.

"When people talk specifically about emergency medicine and ask the question about whether they would be better off going to a bigger hospital, I ask them what it would feel like to hold their breath for 10 minutes," Dr. O'Loughlin says. "That is essentially what you are doing if you don't go to the nearest provider in an emergency. The faster we can administer care, the more likely we will have a positive outcome."

It is that unique role played by the emergency provider that most appeals to Dr. O'Loughlin.

"I enjoy the contained aspect of the care," he says. "What I mean is, someone comes with a complaint, we identify the complaint, and we initiate treatment of the complaint. In a way it has a beginning, a middle and an end. That aspect of my work is very rewarding."

Dr. O'Loughlin adds that while Story Medical is smaller than hospitals in larger surrounding towns, the approach to emergency care is identical and he and the team are prepared for anything.

"In an emergency, by definition, time is of the essence," Dr. O'Loughlin says. "Especially when we are talking about conditions like heart attack, stroke or something like sepsis.

Nehls Walks the Walk

Determined to lose weight, Maxwell man makes movement a priority

Don't let the distinctive look of Donavan Nehls distract you. The time the 70-year-old from Maxwell spends at Story Medical is less about fashion and more about getting healthy.

"Dr. (Art) Check jump-started me," says Nehls who works out in the Medically Oriented Gym (MOG) at Story Medical five days a week. "He was going to put me on insulin a couple years ago and I refused it. Then at my physical in November 2018 I weighed in at 323 pounds. That started this whole process."

The process involves getting in 7 to 8 miles on the recumbent bike in the MOG before getting out and doing 3 to 4 more miles of walking.

"As soon as that door pops open in the MOG at 5:30 a.m., I am in there and getting after it," Nehls says.

Nehls' care is overseen by Dr. Art Check, Dr. Kelly Check and Amy Faris, R.N. A suggestion to add to his workout by walking a few additional miles a day was offered up by Gabby King of the MOG. Together, the team at Story Medical has helped Nehls lose close to 100 pounds.



"Along with the walking, a big thing for me has also been changing the way I eat," Nehls says. "I eat a lot more fruits and vegetables and I have limited my sweets. I work with Amy on that. I write down everything I eat and then we review it together and she makes suggestions that help me."

A side benefit of being a dedicated member of the MOG is getting to know so many at the Medical Center. As a former respiratory care worker, it has been wonderful for Nehls to reconnect with those in healthcare.

"I'm getting to know quite a few people here," he says. "I am starting to put names with faces. Everyone here is so supportive and so good to me." "As soon as that door pops open in the gym at 5:30 a.m., I am in there and getting after it."

Acupuncture Provides Relief

Treatment at Ames Natural Health addresses acute symptoms, enhances overall wellbeing

An avid gardener, Bob Oliver of Webster City was eager to turn over the soil as the weather warmed in the Spring of 2015. While working in the yard one day that spring, a critter bit him on the ankle.

The bite itself was insignificant. So insignificant that he couldn't recall exactly when it may have happened. The result of the bite, however, Bob could not miss.

"I had a lot of swelling," he recalls. "I couldn't even put my shoes on. The swelling persisted over two months. I spent a lot of my summer with my foot elevated. I pretty much lost that whole season."

After a series of appointments with his primary care provider and other specialists, it was to determined Bob's symptoms were the result of a brown recluse spider bite. Relatively uncommon in Iowa, the venomous spider's bite can cause painful and uncomfortable symptoms, including significant swelling.

Bob pursued traditional treatment with little relief from his symptoms. It was his wife, Kathy, who suggested he look into alternative therapies. Kathy had previously been a patient of Valerie Stallbaumer, LAc, MSOM, of Story Medical Natural Health in Ames, receiving a variety of services on a regular basis aimed at helping her remain healthy and well.

"We saw an ad for Valerie's practice

at Wheatsfield Grocery in Ames," Bob says. "Kathy had found her experience with Valerie to be a positive and we felt that she would be in tune with what I needed."

"At that point, I had no idea if acupuncture could help at all," Bob continues. "But Valerie decided that we should give it a go. I knew it wasn't going to be a one-and-done and that it would take some time, but I was ready to find some relief."

After a few appointments spread out over weeks, Bob finally began to turn a corner. It wasn't long before his symptoms began to subside, and he began to ramp up his activity.

"It got to the point that I was seeing continual improvement with each appointment," Bob says. "Over the course of about six months we felt like we had effectively dealt with it."

That fact didn't end Bob's treatment regimen. Rather, his success in treating his acute symptoms convinced him regular appointments with Valerie would improve his overall health and wellbeing. He says he now goes every 2-3 months for a "tune up."

"More and more people are seeing the benefits of these therapies," Bob says. "In my case, with the acute injury, I feel like I worked with my body to gradually return to health instead of shocking it with something extreme like pharmaceuticals or surgery."

"As long as I can afford it," Bob continues, "I don't want to go without acupuncture care."
