# Healing that Goes Beyond the Surface

More than a decade ago, Laura Seiser was a runner at her breaking point. Looking for any type of relief from pervasive and significant foot pain, she scheduled an appointment at Story Medical Natural Health in Ames. New to natural health, she wasn't sure what to expect.

Despite living 45 minutes away, Laura has no hesitation about making the drive.

"I even use my personal days from work to schedule acupuncture," she says. "It's how I choose to take care of myself."

# **Looking Forward**

Even as she now faces a knee injury that may require surgery, Laura is already planning how acupuncture will support her recovery. She says as soon as she is able, she will be back to see Valerie with the confidence it will help her in rehabbing her injured knee.

Laura encourages others to be open-minded when it comes to their health.

"You don't have to choose one type of care over another," she says. "Just be willing to explore what might help. Acupuncture has changed my life."

The Story Medical Natural Health Clinic in Ames offers a variety of Oriental Medicine therapies, including acupuncture.



The World Health Organization and the National Institutes of Health recognize that many common conditions can be helped using acupuncture and other treatment methods of Oriental medicine including back pain, knee pain, headaches, depression, fatigue, allergies, post-COVID problems, women's health, insomnia, stress, general aches and pains, and more. It has also been shown to be an effective preventative health care practice and many choose to receive regular treatments.

# From Flight Physical to Diagnosis

Doug has long relied on Story Medical for his biennial flight physicals—required to maintain his ability to fly for business.

"Dr. Poterucha is fantastic," Doug says. "Her dad is a retired airline pilot, so she really understands the pilot community. She knows the FAA system inside and out, and appointments are always efficient, affordable, and easy."

But when Doug began experiencing shortness of breath while shoveling snow during a Thanksgiving trip to Pennsylvania, he called Story Medical Clinic as soon as he returned. He assumed it was minor respiratory issue. Dr. Poterucha wasn't available that day, so he saw Jyl Wonnell, PA-C, instead.

"I told her I thought it was my lungs. She checked me out and told me I had a heart murmur," Doug says. "That definitely got my attention."

After identifying the murmur, Jyl quickly scheduled Doug for an echocardiogram. The exam, conducted at Story Medical, was efficient and reassuring.

"Everyone made me feel at ease and got things done quickly," he says.

The results were sent to Mayo Clinic, where Doug was diagnosed with a mitral valve prolapse—requiring surgery to repair a damaged heart valve.

Following a successful procedure, he returned to Story Medical for post-surgical care.

# **Dr. Leeds Retires**


After decades of dedicated service in central Iowa, Dr. Tim Leeds has officially retired. His last day at Story Medical Clinic – Nevada was March 24.
